Resolution EC-53/2

IFAG 2021 to consider 'the need to review and possibly update the IOC's Rules of Procedure in order to align and adapt them to the prevailing United Nations' best practices concerning online meetings facilitating informed and timely decisionmaking by IOC Member States'

Governance & Working Methods: Review of the Rules of Procedure

- IOC RoP do not prohibit online meetings but some clauses 'imply' presence for technical reasons (ex. secret ballot for elections)
- UNESCO did not update its RoP but adopted Guidelines for on-line meetings
- A nimber of issues in the current RoP could benefit from clarification (ex. discrepancies between language versions, procedure for consultation by correspondence etc)
- Two sets of rules one for the Assembly and one for the EC are suggested



Governance & Working Methods: Review of the Rules of Procedure

Proposed timeline:

- EC to review the first draft of its RoPs at the 55th session in 2022
- Assembly to adopt its RoPs at its 32nd session in 2023
- EC <u>extraordinary</u> session after the 32nd session of the Assembly to adopt its RoPs
- Guidelines for online meeting to be adopted by both GBs at the same time as the RoPs

Review to focus on clarifications and alignment of without substantive changes to existing Rules



Governance & Working Methods: Reporting on in-kind contributions

Concern: Current reporting – IOC/A-31/3.2.Doc(2), table 5 – does not provide a comprehensive overview and is not based on a collectively agreed approach

Proposal: Annex I the report of IFAG Chair - IOC/A-31/4.3.Doc(1) – provides a discussion paper for the Financial Committee

Objectives: agree on reporting criteria (what to report) and adopt a systematic approach to information collection through an annual Circular Letter
