#### **UNESCO IOC TSUNAMI READY INDICATORS**

#### I ASSESSMENT (ASSESS)

- 1 ASSESS-1. Tsunami hazard zones are mapped and designated
- ASSESS-2. The number of people at risk in the tsunami hazard zone is estimated
- ASSESS-3. Economic, infrastructural, political, and social resources are identified

#### II PREPAREDNESS (PREP)

- PREP-1. Easily understood tsunami evacuation maps are approved
- 5 PREP-2. Tsunami information is publicly displayed
- PREP-2. Outreach and public awareness and education resources are available and distributed
- 7 PREP-3. Outreach or educational activities <u>are held at least</u> three times a year
- 8 PREP-4: A community tsunami exercise is conducted at least every two years

#### III RESPONSE (RESP)

- 9 RESP-1. A community tsunami emergency response plan (ERP) is approved
- RESP-2. The capacity to manage emergency response operations during a tsunami is in place
- RESP-3. Redundant and reliable means to timely receive 24-hour official tsunami alerts are in place
- RESP-4. Redundant and reliable means to timely disseminate 24-hour official tsunami alerts to the public are in place

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## **TOWS-WG:** Tsunami Community Preparedness

- □ Decides: 'A Safe Ocean' societal outcome' aim to make 100% of communities at risk of tsunami prepared for and resilient to tsunamis by 2030 through UNESCO/IOC Tsunami Ready Programme and other initiatives
  - Adopt UNESCO-IOC Tsunami Ready Guidelines / Indicators (TS 74) as international std for evidence-based community preparedness
  - Enhance access and capacity development (high-res DEM, tsunami sources) for inundation modelling / evac mapping
  - Enhance integration to minimize disaster impacts. Rapid restoration of socioeconomic activities and critical infrastructure services

#### Encourages

- Use best practices in engineering design and construction of evacuation shelters, especially against local tsunamis
- Use IOTIC-compiled School Disaster Risk Reduction / preparedness materials

## **TOWS-WG: Instructs ICGs**

- i. Continue IOC UNDRR World Tsunami Awareness Day strong collaboration for (2020 / 2021 WTAD - 30 videos highlighting countries joining global Tsunami Ready community)
- ii. Urgently complete IOC Technical Series 74 Tsunami Ready recognition programme indicators / guidelines for widespread distr
- iii. Include Local Tsunami Source SOPs as an important component of Tsunami Ready programme;
- iv. Develop standardized trainings (online or in person) in particular through <u>Ocean Teacher Global Academy (OTGA)</u>;
- V. For next Tsunami Symposium, incorporate diversity in organizing committee (incl all regions); venue for hybrid meeting to enable most people to successfully engage, explore funding



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## **Milestones**

- □ Adopt UNESCO-IOC Tsunami Ready Guidelines / Indicators (TS 74) as international standard for evidence-based community preparedness → Global measure
- □ Establish Tsunami Ready Programme Process
  - 1. PTWS recommendation (Dec 2021, this meeting)
  - 2. TOWS WG approval on TT Disaster Management and Preparedness recommendation (Feb 2022)
  - 3. IOC Executive Council approval (June 2022)
- □ Deploy Tsunami Ready Programme

### PTWS-XXIX ACTIONS

- 1. Reference: Standard Guidelines for the Tsunami Ready Recognition Programme (MG 74) publish 2021
  - Frameworks & agreements (DRM, TEWS, Sendai DRR, SDG), Background, TR (Aim, Conditions, Indicators, Implementation Workflow - Steps / Application, Signs, Certificates), Glossary, Tools & References
- 2. Ensure TR aligned with other PTWS and IOC documents
  - PTWS Medium Term Strategy 2022-2030
  - PTWS Key Performance Indicators (KPI) still evolving
  - IOC MTS 2022-2029, Capacity Development Strategy 2015-2023
- 3. Endorse establishment of TR Programme (from Pilot)
- 4. Enable PTWS Support Resources People, Tools, Funding
  - Advocacy (high-level political, community, champions)
  - Inter-ICG sharing (PTWS-CARIBE-EWS, PTWS-IOTWMS, SIDS)
  - Enhanced access for DEM, Identified Tsunami Source (expert meetings)
  - Regional resource hubs (technical for DEM, modeling, GIS)
