- > Provides online survey capability
- > Runs training programmes
- ➤ Helps promote tsunami awareness (eg WTAD)
- ➤ Manages externally funded projects
- ➤ Provides secretariat support to IOC-UNESCO Working Group on Tsunami and Other hazards related to sea level Warning and mitigation Systems (TOWS-WG) and its Task Team on Tsunami Watch Operations and two ad hoc teams related to Tsunamis generated by non-seismic and complex sources

- Supported online surveys and report publication for Capacity Assessment, IOWAVE 2020 and COVID preparedness.








ICG/IOTWMS Secretariat Achievements

<u>PROJECT GOAL</u>: Timely delivery of national tsunami warnings to at-risk coastal communities who are prepared to respond effectively (Tsunami Ready)

Phase 1: Hazard and risk assessment

National tsunami warning chain development

Phase 2: Inundation and evacuation mapping capacity development

Phase 3: At-risk coastal community preparedness

Phase 1 completed 30 Oct21 (24 months)

Phase 2a and 2b to be completed 20 Dec22 (12 months)

Phase 2c proposal submitted and proposed start April 2023
