OUTCOME 1

IO 1.1. Communities (especially vulnerable groups) plan and implement effective, inclusive, and integrated disaster preparedness and climate change adaptation activities.

- Increased evacuation centres that are inclusive for aged, gender, persons with disability and diverse SOGIESC and the vulnerable minorities.
- A greater percentage of hazard prone communities and faiths are better prepared for climate resilient, inclusive disaster preparedness approaches for higher occurring disasters i.e. cyclones, storm surges, floods, tsunamis
- More integrated approaches for preparedness and adaptation received by communities.

Linking with Tsunami Ready – Community Focus:

- Weave Tsunami Ready with established or soon-to-beestablished Community
 Disaster Management Plans.
- Carry out simulation
 exercises for multiple
 hazards including Tsunami
 Ready drills.
- Community are disaster/tsunami prepared.

OUTCOME 2

IO 1.2. Local civil society actors (NGOs, CBOs, OPDs, churches, informal groups) have improved institutional and technical capacity to fulfil their role in effective disaster preparedness and climate change adaptation.

- Partners are more inclusive in their planning (budget allocation, position), implementation (awareness, strengthening capacity, targeted activities and recipients) and reporting (disaggregated data, monitoring, identification of vulnerabilities in communities, stories)
- Capacity strengthening of partners tying into capacity audit and staff accreditation.
- Collaboration amongst Partners increased through integrated climate resilience and disaster preparedness approaches and engagement with communities, implementing (peer to peer review), cost sharing, research, and networking.
- AHP's reach to communities extended and strengthened through its Volunteer Network/Program (including DCOSS, Women's groups, and Church Youth).

Linking with Tsunami Ready – NGO capacity strengthening focus:

- Opportunities to work with UNESCO for more training opportunities so that we grow/strengthen the skillset for Disaster/Tsunami Ready practitioners; and
- More Tsunami Ready trainers support Government to reach more communities and have more coverage.

OUTCOME 3

IO 1.3. National and Sub-national governments are supported to lead effective, inclusive and coordinated disaster preparedness, climate change adaptation and response activities.

- Government reach and response (activation) to communities extended and strengthened through the support of Volunteer Network/Program (including DCOSS and Church Youth)
- Awareness and technical capacity of national agencies strengthened through inclusion, WASH, EOC, EC, safe programming (accredited training programs).
- Network/Community of Practice established (Localisation, Sustainability, Shared Learning).
