#### WG1 Relevance to TOR WG3



- 1. Monitor and evaluate the implementation Tsunami Ready Recognition Programme TRRP, National Warning Chains, and related activities to deliver tsunami resilient and prepared communities for the Indian Ocean
- 2. Provide guidance on tsunami hazard and risk assessment, including for tsunamis generated by non-seismic and complex sources.
- 3. Provide guidance on how to nationally initiate IOC-UNESCO Tsunami Ready Recognition Programme (TRRP) and similar initiatives.
- 4. Develop exercise tools and coordinate implementation of IOWAVE Exercises and other drills as required
- In collaboration with IOC-UNESCO IOTIC and IOC-UNESCO Secretariat for ICG/IOTWMS, identify capacity development and resource needs of Member States to implement TRRP, national tsunami warning chains, and related activities.
- Assist with training programmes of Member States implemented by IOC-UNESCO IOTIC and coordinated by IOC-UNESCO ICG/IOTWMS Secretariat to facilitate enhanced national tsunami warning chains and at-risk communities becoming resilient and prepared for tsunamis

#### **Activities Relevant to WG3**



- Prepare UNESCO IOC Tsunami Global Symposium → WG3
- Review and update CATP tools to be inline with the needs of WG1, WG3, WG2 and Task Teams
- Stimulate and share information on best-practices between Member States in 2023-204:
  - 1. News-letter monthly or bi-monthly  $\rightarrow$  actively WAG  $\rightarrow$  socializing WG 3 activities to wider people.
  - 2. Special Issue Journal to response the Ocean Decade Challenges will be launched call for paper in March 2024 and publish during UNESCO IOC Global Tsunami Symposium → *best practice to share*
  - 3. Open access edited book "Two Decades After 2004 Indian Ocean Tsunami: Reflection and the Way Forward", drawing upon inputs from each session editor HPR, DA and RH → *synthesis of discussion of TR*
- Research grant from BC (HPR, DA and RH) for Indonesia : Disability inclusive higher education for tsunami disaster risk reduction → to promote the involvement of educated disabilities participating in the development SOP for evacuation. → input as food for thoughts for TR Indicator on disability issues
- Contribute to the work of TTDMP TOWS WG to response objectives of UN ODTB:
  - Synergizing with Local and National Resilient Programmes, including Tsunami → The aspirational social outcome of the Ocean Decade Tsunami Programme is that 100% of communities at risk from tsunamis are prepared for and resilient to tsunamis by 2030 through efforts like the IOC-UNESCO Tsunami Ready Recognition Programme.

#### **Activities Relevant to WG3**



- Contribute to the work of TOWS WG the needs for the discussion and prepare guideline learning from ICGIOTWMS issues
  of mainstream tsunami Disaster Risk Reduction into sustainable development to help achieve resilient communities in the
  region:
  - Critical Infrastructures → support program of WG3 with guidelines
  - ISO 22328-3 (Community-based Early Warning Systems for Tsunamis)
  - UNDRR Make Cities Resilience MCR 2030

#### WG1 Issues and Challenges to respond UNODTP by 2030



- 1. The awareness preparedness and response capabilities of a community will depend on → through active engagement of stakeholders at the national and local level on the following component
  - Risk perception and awareness → The awareness of risk and self-evacuation capacities are particularly
    important where tsunami waves might arrive within minutes, and in SIDs and LDCs where warning
    capacity and infrastructure are limited
  - Community wide preparedness actions
  - Effective Response Planning and Capabilities
- 2. Implementation of Mitigation Measures:
  - a. by 2030 all at-risk communities have tsunami evacuation maps.
  - b. by 2030 communities have access to an inventory of best practices of plans and *structural and nature-based solutions* and that more communities have implemented plans and measures to minimize impacts to *critical infrastructure and marine assets* from tsunamis and other coastal hazards, and importantly *mainstreaming disaster risk reduction into urban planning*.
- 3. To ensure investment in capacity development for the different stakeholders involved in the tsunami warning and dissemination processes

#### WG1 Issues and Challenges to respond UNODTP by 2030



- 4. To encourage and promote *inclusiveness and gender diversity*, and that youth and early career professionals
- 5. to ensure investment in capacity development for the different stakeholders involved in the tsunami warning and dissemination processes, through:
  - OTGA-STC
  - Others which focus on SIDs and LCDs
  - Others with new breakthrough ....
- 6. to put emphasize initiatives of awareness and preparedness on non-seismic tsunami

# WG1 relevant with WG3 Plans and timelines 2024



- 2024: 2nd UNESCO IOC Tsunami Global Symposium 11-14 November 2024
- Refine CAPT tools completed by Mid March 2024 hand it over to Secretariat
- Research grant from British Council (HPR, DA and RH): Disability inclusive higher education for tsunami disaster risk reduction → development SOP for evacuation (March – December 2024)
- Special Issue Journal to response the Ocean Decade Challenges will be launched call for paper in March 2024 and publish during UNESCO IOC Global Tsunami Symposium
- Open access UNESCO IOC Publication edited book "Two Decades After 2004 Indian Ocean Tsunami: Reflection and the Way Forward", drawing upon inputs from 2<sup>nd</sup> UNESCO IOC Global TsunaminSymposium each session - editor HPR, DA and RH (November 2024 – publish in February 2025
- to conduct initiatives of awareness and preparedness on non-seismic tsunami (e.g. guidelines, best practices data base) for 2024-2026
