# EXPECTED OUTCOMES FOR IOC & APPROACH TO IOC ENGAGEMENT



The desired outcome of UNOC for IOC is to advance ocean science and knowledge as a basis for action in line with our mandate & strategic priorities through:

- Engagement in UNOC that is primarily structured around a small number of <u>flagship initiatives and related key messages</u>
- 2. Using UNOC & pre-conference events as a <u>key moment in the</u> <u>process of developing / launching these initiatives</u> i.e. through building constituencies, developing partnerships and raising awareness
- 3. Less focus than in previous UNOCs, COPs etc. on standalone / oneoff events
