



- Launched at AAORIA Forum, October 2024 with action-oriented recommendations drawing on Vision 2030 and Barcelona Statement priorities
- Actions structured around following categories:
 - 1. Fulfil science and knowledge priorities
 - 2. Strengthen policy frameworks as drivers of Decade Actions
 - 3. Enhance recognition and role of all knowledge systems
 - 4. Translate global priorities to the regional and national levels
 - 5. Increase action and impact at national level
 - 6. Increase sustained and sustainable investment in essential ocean science infrastructure
 - 7. Increase meaningful investment in capacity development
 - 8. Create meaningful engagement of industry and the innovation sector
 - 9. Develop and share best practices, standardised methodologies, and policies
 - 10. Ensure targeted, expanded, and sustained financing and resourcing for Decade Actions
 - 11. Enhance diversity, inclusivity, and equity
 - 12. Strengthen links between the scientific community and professional communicators, and expand efforts in ocean literacy to address all sectors of society
 - 13. Further optimise Ocean Decade coordination for collective impact and ownership


Summary

With reference to the UN General Assembly A/RES/72/73, which proclaimed the United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development 2021–2030, the year 2025 marks the mid-point in the implementation of the Ocean Decade under the coordination of UNESCO-IOC and the launch of a mid-term evaluation process.

This document outlines the proposed scope, modalities, and timing of the mid-term evaluation process. Following discussions at the Executive Council it will be used to develop the detailed Terms of Reference of the evaluation, the results of which will be presented at the next IOC Assembly.

<u>Financial and administrative implications</u>: The evaluation will be funded through UNESCO's Internal Oversight Service.

The proposed decision is referenced as <u>Draft Resolution EC-57/[4.7]</u> in the Action Paper (document IOC/EC-57/AP Prov. Rev.)



Draft scoping framework for mid-term evaluation presented to IOC Executive Council in June 2024, as in Dec 4.7:

10. ...develop the detailed **Terms** of **Reference** of the Evaluation...;

11. Requests the UNESCO Internal Oversight Service to carry out the Evaluation...and to present the results to the IOC Assembly at its 33rd session



Evaluation purpose

"...review the structures, processes, partnerships, and resources that underpin the delivery of the Ocean Decade and make recommendations to optimise the impact of the Ocean Decade."

"...explore both causes and solutions to issues that are identified as hindering implementation and delivery of the Decade..."



Evaluation scope


Timeframe: January 2021 to early 2025 Focus on 5 main areas:

- ✓ Governance and coordination
- ✓ Resource mobilization
- ✓ Science knowledge and delivery including consolidation of impact
- ✓ Tracking progress, engagement, inclusivity and outreach
- ✓ Leveraging of Ocean Decade to contribute to IOC vision and evolution



Data collection methods

- Document review
- Raw data analysis
- Individual survey (> 450 responses)
- Focus groups (NDCs, DCCs, DAB etc.)
- One on one interviews (> 80 discussions with MS, key partners etc.)
- Social network analysis
- Policy / bibliometric analysis

2027 Ocean Decade Conference

- Instrumental to track progress of achievements since 2024 Ocean Decade Conference and lay groundwork for post-2030 legacy of Ocean Decade
- Call for Expressions of Interest for host country: 22 November 2024 10 January 2025 via Circular Letter No. 3013
- 6 EOIs received and will be discussed with Officers on basis of following criteria:
 - i. Strategic interest in hosting
 - ii. Overall approach to design and development
 - iii. Experience in organizing similar events
 - iv. Approach to ensuring diversity
 - v. Travel and logistical information
 - vi. Financial and logistical support
 - vii. Government support / NDC engagement
- Shortlisted EOIs will be requested to submit full proposal in May 2025
