EXPECTED OUTCOMES FOR IOC & APPROACH TO IOC ENGAGEMENT



The desired outcome of UNOC for IOC is to advance ocean science and knowledge as a basis for action in line with our mandate & strategic priorities through:

- Engagement in UNOC that is primarily structured around a <u>small</u> <u>number of key messages</u>
- 2. Using UNOC & pre-conference events as a <u>key moment in the</u> <u>process of developing / launching flagship initiatives</u> i.e. through building constituencies, developing partnerships and raising awareness
- 3. Less focus than in previous UNOCs, COPs etc. on standalone / one-off events

Focus of IOC Messaging



Overall message: science and knowledge is essential for action to achieve SDG14

Commission

Key Messages:

- a. Role of Ocean Decade to fill critical science and knowledge priorities & enabling conditions as identified in The Barcelona Statement.
- b. Urgency of sustained and sustainable investment in critical ocean science activities and infrastructure for observations and data.
- c. Importance of evidence based sustainable ocean plans including support to Member States to develop and implement SOPs.
- d. Accelerated commitments needed to achieve 2030 goal for seabed mapping including through unlocking existing data and generating new data.

Political Declaration Messaging



Negotiations on zero draft will take place in New York on 27th January followed by up to 3 other sessions in advance of adoption before 1 May 2025

IOC CL will be prepared for Member States to inform negotiations focusing on (i) high-level recommendations, and (ii) detailed language suggestions based on zero draft.

High level recommendations to strengthen zero draft include recognition of:

- Science and knowledge priorities identified through 2024 Ocean Decade Conference
- Commitments to seabed mapping efforts
- Commitments for increased MS financing and investment including for capacity development
- Importance of full range of ocean related goals and targets of the Global Biodiversity Framework (in addition to 30 x 30 MPA target)
- Importance of supporting marine scientific capacity for effective implementation of BBNJ
- Importance of ecosystem benefits of Sustainable Ocean Plans
